HOSPITALIZATION OF JUVENILE ARRESTEES

Effective immediately, members shall adhere to the following procedures regarding the hospitalization of a juvenile arrestee(s):

Misdemeanor: Juvenile(s) charged with a misdemeanor offense, who are admitted to the hospital for treatment will be placed under a guard detail until the identity of the juvenile has been verified by AFIS (Automated Fingerprint Identification Section). It shall be the responsibility of the arresting officer to immediately notify the Juvenile Processing Center that the juvenile is being admitted to the hospital. The juvenile arrest will be documented in the Hospital Log Book, located at the Juvenile Processing Center. A member from the Juvenile Processing Center shall respond to the hospital to photograph and fingerprint the juvenile, prior to the end of the tour of duty.

Upon positive identification of the fingerprints, a PD 379 and 252 will be completed. A member from the Juvenile Processing Center will respond to the hospital and serve the juvenile with a PD 694 (Notice to Appear in Family Court, Office of the Attorney General). If the juvenile cannot be printed, the arresting officer in coordination with the Juvenile Processing Center will take reasonable means to identify the juvenile and complete the paperwork.

In nonviolent misdemeanor cases where the juvenile has been identified, and there is no other reason to seek detention, MPD (Juvenile Processing Officer) may release the youth at the hospital and discontinue the guard detail. MPD will use the same release conditions as they would if the youth had been brought to the Juvenile Processing Center. If the juvenile is released, the arresting officer will paper the case at the Office of the Attorney General following the same time frame and other requirements that they would have followed for a non-hospital release case (i.e., the case will be treated as an MPD citation release case).

Until the identity of the juvenile has been verified by AFIS, the member on the guard detail shall notify the Juvenile Processing Center at the beginning of each tour of duty of the juvenile's status. The guard detail will be released after the PD 694 has been fully executed by a member of the Juvenile Processing Center.

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
Felony: Juveniles charged with a felony offense, who is admitted to the hospital, will be placed under a guard detail. It shall be the responsibility of the arresting officer to immediately notify the Juvenile Processing Center of the hospitalization. The date and time the juvenile arrived at the hospital shall be documented in the Hospital Log Book, located at the Juvenile Processing Center. A member from the Juvenile Processing Center shall immediately respond to the hospital to photograph and fingerprint the juvenile. The information shall be submitted to AFIS for positive identification. The member on the guard detail shall notify the Juvenile Processing Center at the beginning of each tour of duty of the juvenile's status.

In all other cases, and where the juvenile cannot be identified, the arresting officer will paper the case on the next day that court hearings are held. These cases will be papered in the same manner that they would have if the juvenile were in the cell block. In the event that the hospitalized youth cannot be identified, the arresting officer will complete the PD 379 and 252 showing the juvenile to be a "John/Jane Doe."

The United States Attorney's Office (USAO) or the Office of the Attorney General (OAG) will be prepared to arraign the juvenile on the next day after the juvenile has been admitted to the hospital.

If the Court decides to **release the juvenile**, the MPD guard detail will be lifted. The release order will be faxed to the Juvenile Processing Center. Upon receipt of the order, a member from the Juvenile Processing Center will respond to the hospital and serve the release order/notice on the juvenile.

If the Court decides to **detain the juvenile**, the Department of Youth Rehabilitation Services (DYRS) will take over the guard detail. A copy of the detention order will be faxed to the Juvenile Processing Center and the Juvenile Processing Center will notify the Watch Commander of the unit maintaining the guard detail of the detention order. DYRS personnel will present a copy of the detention order to MPD and proper government identification when they assume the guard detail. DYRS will assume the guard detail until the juvenile is transported to the DYRS.
