

Uniformed Officer Assistance for the Victim Services Branch

The FLSU is comprised of three (3) civilians who provide support services, education about the criminal justice process and victim advocacy to survivors of homicide. Currently, the majority of these services are being provided by way of the telephone. However, in order to enhance the services and provide more meaningful and effective victim services; services will be facilitated directly in the community by the FLSU. A major goal of the FLSU is to increase survivor(s) involvement during the investigative process and leverage communication between the community and the department. Their efforts will foster a better relationship between the survivor(s) of a homicide and may result in a timelier arrest/case closure rate. The FLSU's non-partisan role will display a genuine concern for the survivor(s). Their role is critical to the survivor(s) and will help them during their recovery from the loss of a loved one.

This teletype is being issued to inform District Commanders, Watch Commanders, and PSA Lieutenants to assign a patrol services area (PSA) officer to help facilitate home visits Monday-Friday during the day work tour of duty, with the Family Liaison Specialist's Unit (FLSU). The PSA officer's presence during the FLSU visit will help maintain a safe environment for both the homicide survivor and the civilian staff member(s).

Effectively immediately, FLSU member(s) will within seventy-two (72) hours following a homicide, coordinate visits with the affected PSA Lieutenant(s). The affected PSA Lieutenant will then assign a member from his/her PSA to accompany the FLSU member(s). It is anticipated that the home visits will last no longer than one (1) hour per each visit, once at the survivor(s) residence. The Watch Commander should document the home visits on their Watch Command Report.
