Election Day Voting Process for General Election, November 4, 2008

The purposes of this teletype is to remind members of their responsibilities for the General Election to be held on Tuesday, November 4, 2008 for supporting the Board of Elections and Ethics (BOEE) and ensuring the safety and security of the voting public while they are at designated polling locations.

Metropolitan Police Department Responsibilities

The responsibilities of the Metropolitan Police Department members for Election Day have been established by G.O. SPT 303.07, dated June 11, 2003. District Commanders and Officials, and their civilian equivalents, shall familiarize themselves with the contents of the General Order and review with assigned members. Members are reminded that:

- The Special Operations Division is responsible for providing security for the BOEE vehicles and members collecting ballot boxes.
- District Commanders shall familiarize themselves with all polling locations within their respective Districts; assign special attention to the polling locations beginning the night before the election through the night following the conclusion of the election; and ensure that periodic inspections of the polling locations are conducted during voting-related activity.
- District Commanders shall ensure that scooter patrols are assigned to provide special attention to the polling locations beginning at 0630 hours on Election Day, and until the ballot boxes have been removed from the location. Scooter patrols shall not be assigned more than five (5) separate polling locations to monitor.
- Members shall exercise their discretion when enforcing parking regulations around polling locations during voting hours.
- District Commanders shall submit a report to the Chief of Police within seven (7) business days of the election of any unusual incident that occurred in, or around, any polling place. A negative report is required.

In addition, the First District Commander shall detail one member with a hand-held radio to the BOEE in the Judiciary Square building at 0630 hours to assist the Administrative Assistant and Election Board Officials. This detail shall be maintained until all of the election boxes have been received at the BOEE Headquarters, and the Board official at the Judiciary Square building advises the Official then in charge of the Department (Field Commander) that the detail is no longer required.
